RE: 4-H Exploration Days

4-H Exploration Days offers youth from across Michigan an opportunity each summer to choose from over 200 fun-filled, hands-on sessions while trying out the college experience by staying on the Michigan State University campus for three days. Youth may choose from sessions ranging across the spectrum of everything 4-H has to offer, whether you are looking to sharpen your skills in your favorite project area or try on something new. In addition to learning and staying in the dorms, youth also have the opportunity to partake in several other leisure activities including dancing, swimming, sports, checking out some of the many unique attractions of Michigan State University.

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- Exploration Days will be held **June 24-26, 2015 at MSU**
- 4-H and non-4-H members welcome, as well as 4-H volunteers
- Ages 11-19 on January 1, 2015
- Registration due to county office **April 30, 2015**; sessions filled on first come basis, beginning on **March 17, 2015**.
- Registration is \$165, with \$80 deposit due with registration forms (non-4-H members must pay \$10 participation fee in addition)

Registration procedure (please be sure that all forms are legible and 100% complete to ensure accurate and efficient processing; incomplete forms will be returned):

- 1a. Return the 4-H Exploration Days Registration Form (found in the program catalogue or on the website) to the 4-H office; include 8 session choice combinations as some sessions fill quickly
- 1b. Return Authorization Form (2 pages); this form contains 5 parent signatures and 1 youth signature (missing signatures will delay your registration)
- 1c. Remit \$80 deposit with your registration form
- 1d. Submit local scholarship request form with registration
2. Our office will contact you with registration confirmation and other updates; please provide your email address if possible
- 3a. Complete 4-H Exploration Days Personal Data Sheet (with current photo) before attending orientation meeting
- 3b. Pay remaining balance owed by orientation date
- 3c. Pre-event orientation June 3rd; on-site county huddle upon arrival at event (participants are required to attend both orientation sessions)

Participants will have the opportunity to choose 1-full session or 2-half sessions to attend during the event. The registration book, including all session information and registration forms can be downloaded online at: http://4h.msue.msu.edu/4h/4_h_exploration_days. Hardcopies of the book can be obtained from the Ingham County MSU Extension office at 121 East Maple Street, Mason beginning the second week in March. The registration fee includes housing, meals, and most session enrollments (please note in the session description any additional fees for individual sessions). Participants will receive an invoice for their balance due by the orientation date.

Exploration Days is a qualifying MSU pre-college experience; youths entering 8-10 grades in the fall who attend this program will have the opportunity to compete for a \$2,000 MSU scholarship in the fall. http://4h.msue.msu.edu/awards_scholarships/4-h_scholarships#pre-college

Important!!! New Information

There are a few scholarship opportunities available for Ingham County 4-H participants for this event. Please note that the scholarship request procedure has changed from previous years. All participants requesting scholarship assistance for the event will need to complete and submit the attached request form. Further note, that **Ingham County event participation policy has been revised to state that participants that receive scholarship funding and fail to fully participate in the sponsored event will be asked to repay scholarship funds provided.** This includes attending pre-event orientation, all county huddles scheduled during the event, and attending the sessions that the participant has been assigned for the event. A participant may only be excused from their assigned session to attend the “back-up” session that is offered during the event by the head county chaperone (CCA). Participants found skipping their assigned session will not be credited for their scholarships and will be invoiced for the resulting balance for registration.

Available scholarships are as follows:

- State Awards Delegates--\$45 automatically applied
- Financial Hardship Scholarship--\$40 assigned by staff upon request
- New Audience Participation Scholarship--\$40 assigned by staff upon request; 1st time participants only
- 4-H Council and Transportation Committee Scholarships—total \$32, first 50 Ingham County qualifying participants. **NOTE: YOU MUST HAVE PARTICIPATED IN COUNCIL FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES TO QUALIFY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP.** This includes working food booth at fair or working a shift at the TSC Clover Campaign.
